Get comfy

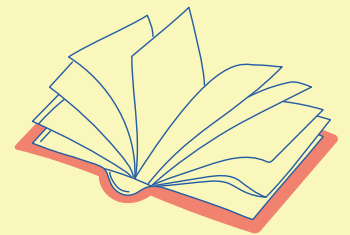


Find a comfy place where you can cuddle with your Buddy and where it's not too noisy.

When you look at the Bible verses you will see there are some strange names and lots of numbers.

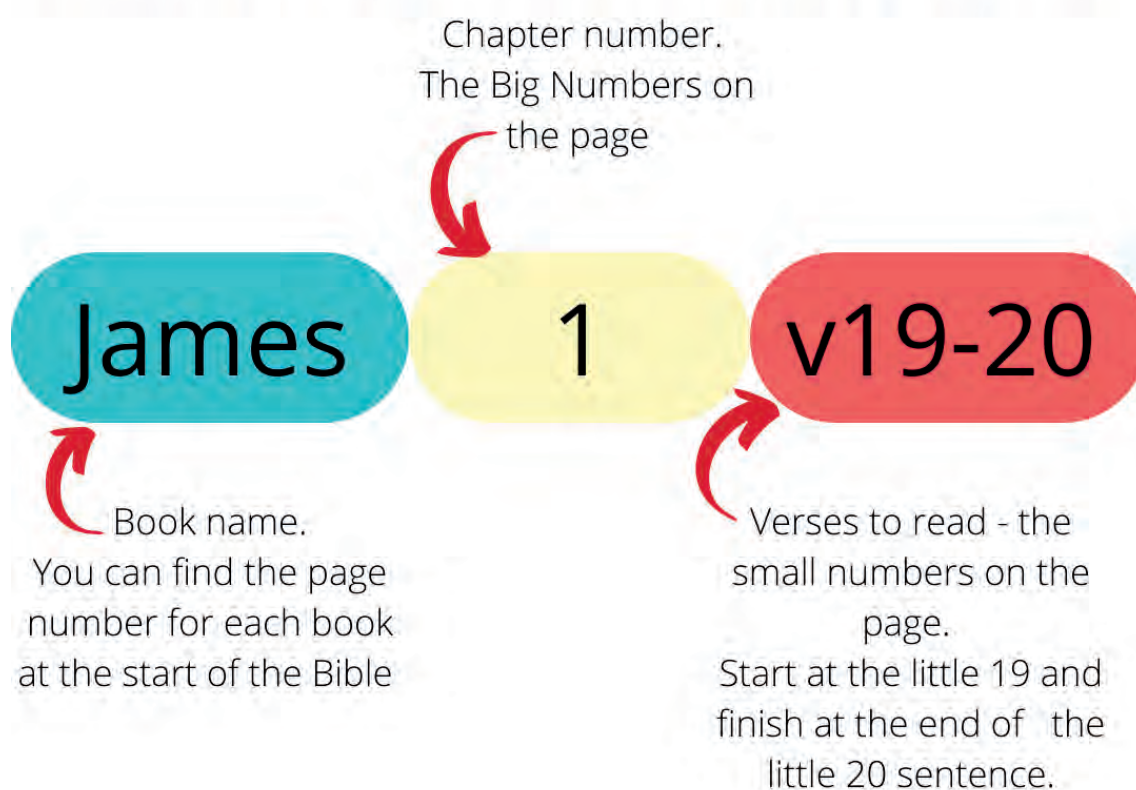
These are the names of books in the Bible and the verse numbers.

Luke 2 v 1-7

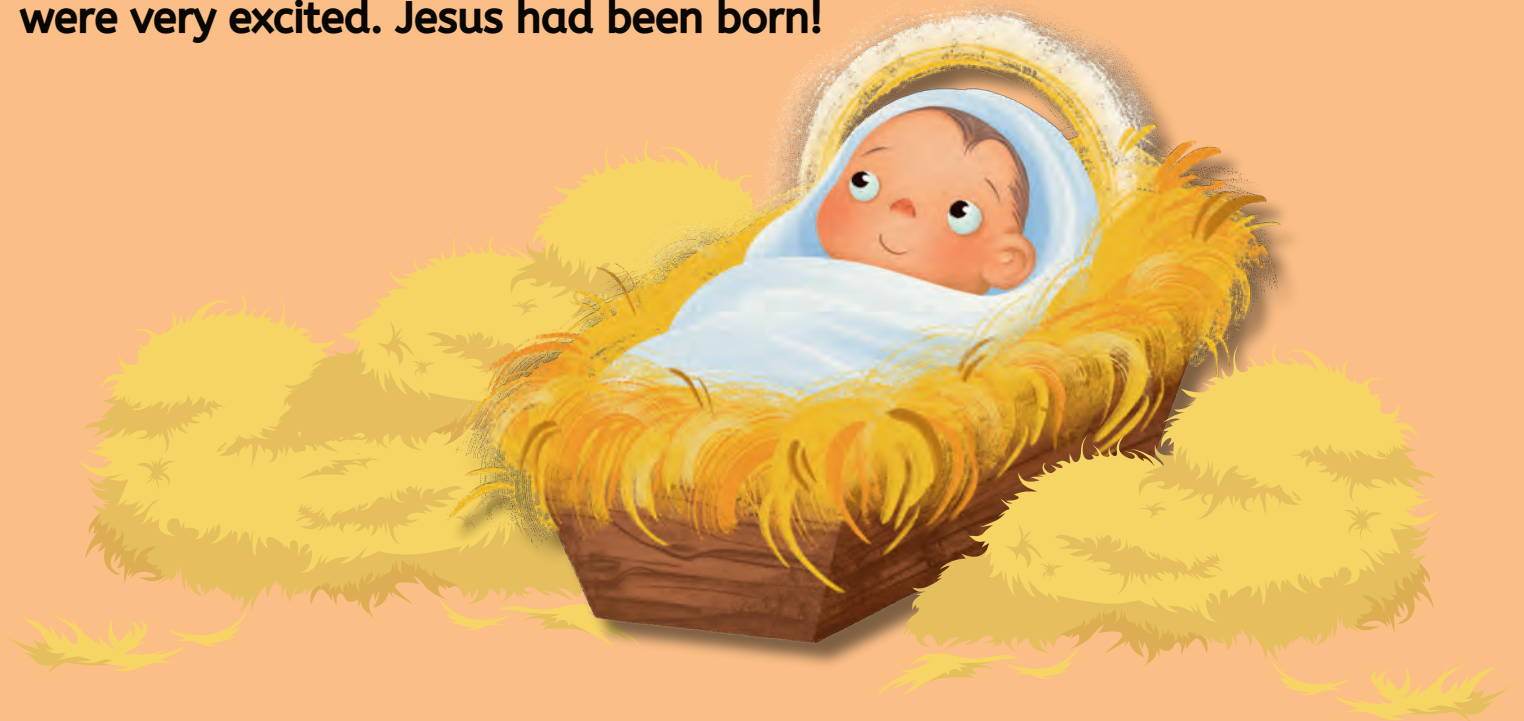

Luke 2 v 7-21

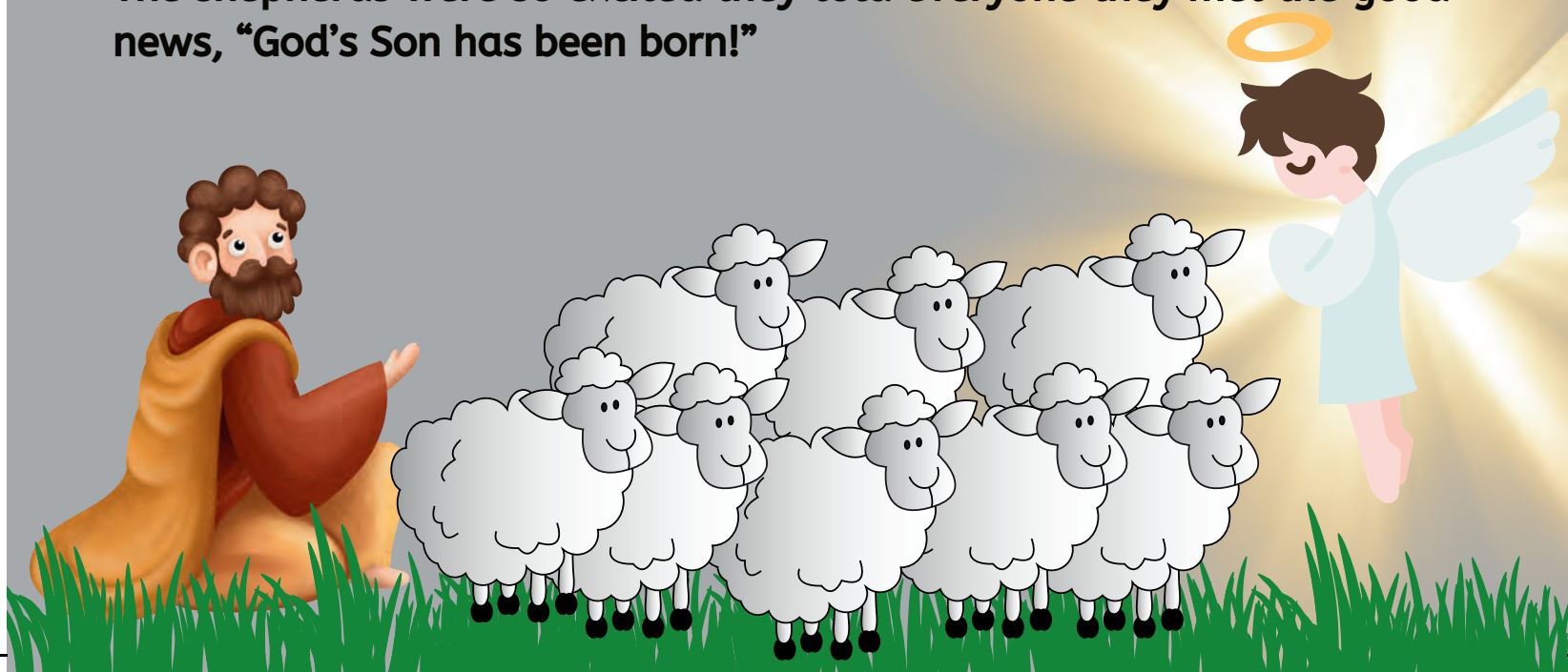
One night, some shepherds were on the hillside outside Bethlehem. Suddenly, there was a dazzling light and an angel appeared. The shepherds were very scared.
