If you do not have a phone or device you can still enjoy our trail simply reading the text on each poster.







If you had your eyes closed, how easy was it to trust the person giving you instructions?


When we put our trust in God He will always help us. His ways are not always the same as our ways but, like Joseph, we can trust Him even in difficult times.

"God, I will thank you forever for what you have done. With those who worship you, I will trust you because you are good." Psalm 52 v 9







"Let us hold on firmly to the hope we profess, because we can trust God to keep his promise." Hebrews 10 v 23.










## The Inn Keeper:

- 5. **Pinkie** the smallest, pray for yourself & your needs last.




