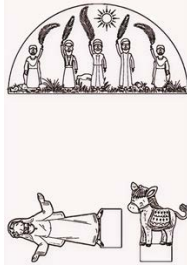




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Assembly Instructions

1



Print (Colour) & Cut

Print the document back to back so that the verse is on the back of the circle.

If you have chosen the colouring in pages allow the children to colour in the scene and characters before cutting them out.

Fold and Cut

Cut out the circle and characters.

Fold circle in half along the mid line. Open again.

Cut along the dotted line.

Glue, Fold Stick

Using a glue stick, glue the triangle shape as shown.

Lift the right hand piece and place over the triangle up to the line then press down to stick.

This should cause the background to stand up and be slightly curved.

Cut around the characters & glue

Having cut the characters - it's easier to leave a margin around them rather than be exact - fold the tab backwards under the character, glue the tab and stick to the floor of the scene. Children might find it easiest to colour in the words before sticking on the characters.

Chat & Listen

Encourage the children to read the Bible verses and look at the image, you could ask wondering questions to encourage discussion, for example "I wonder what people in the crowds were saying about Jesus" Allow them space and time to chat and wonder.

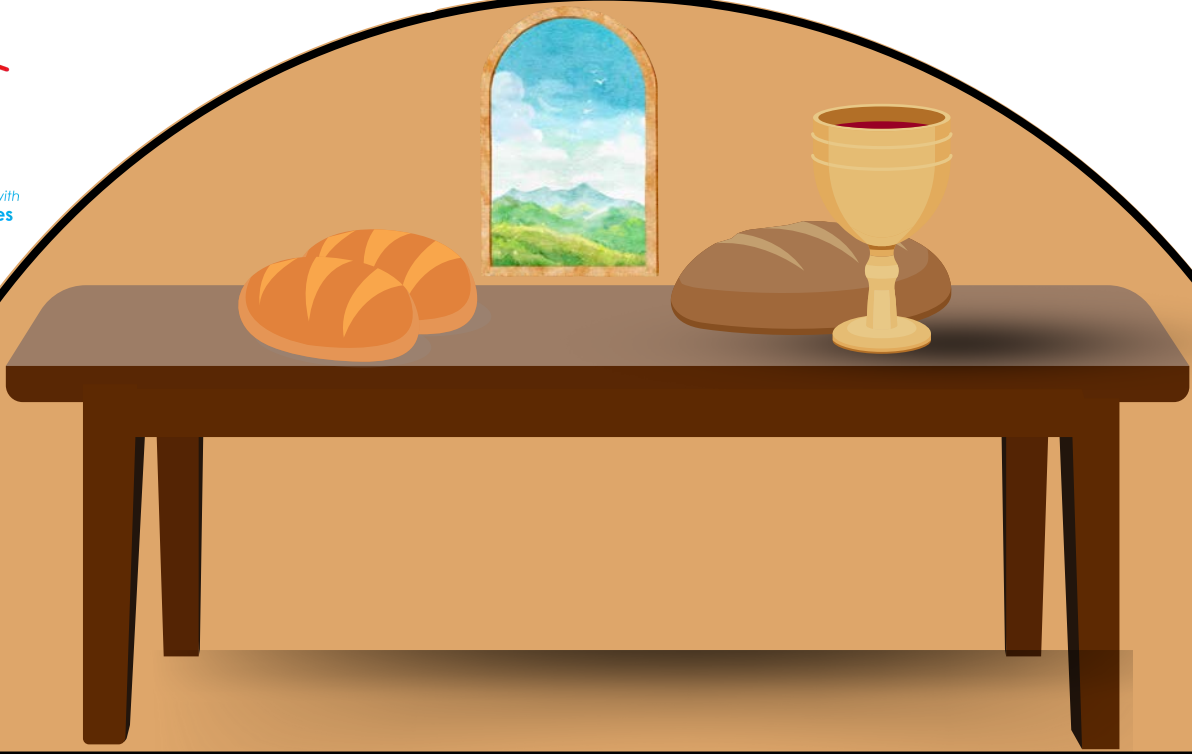
Jesus found a donkey and rode on it, just as the scripture says,

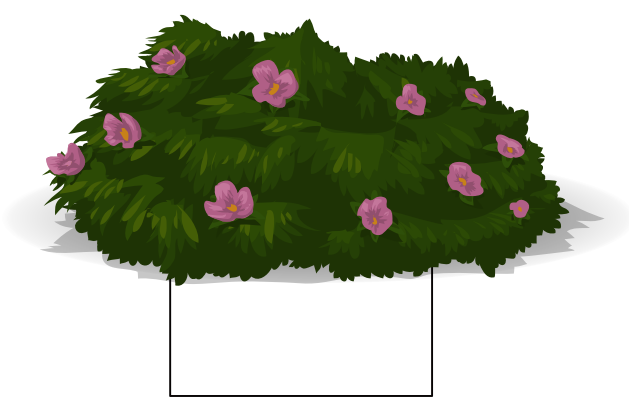
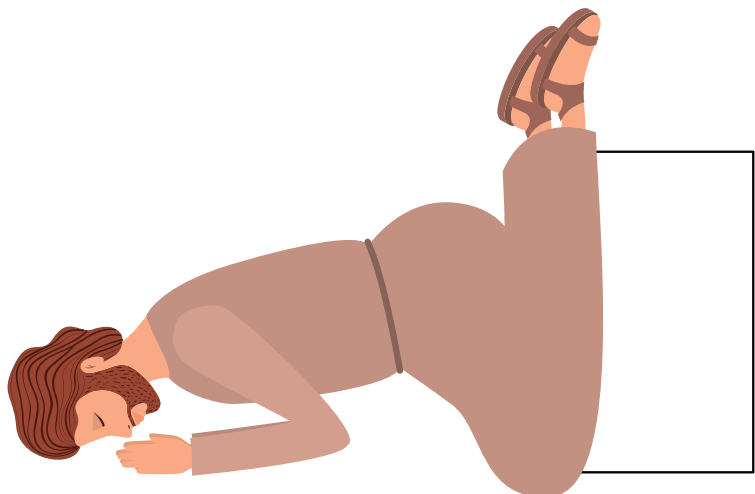
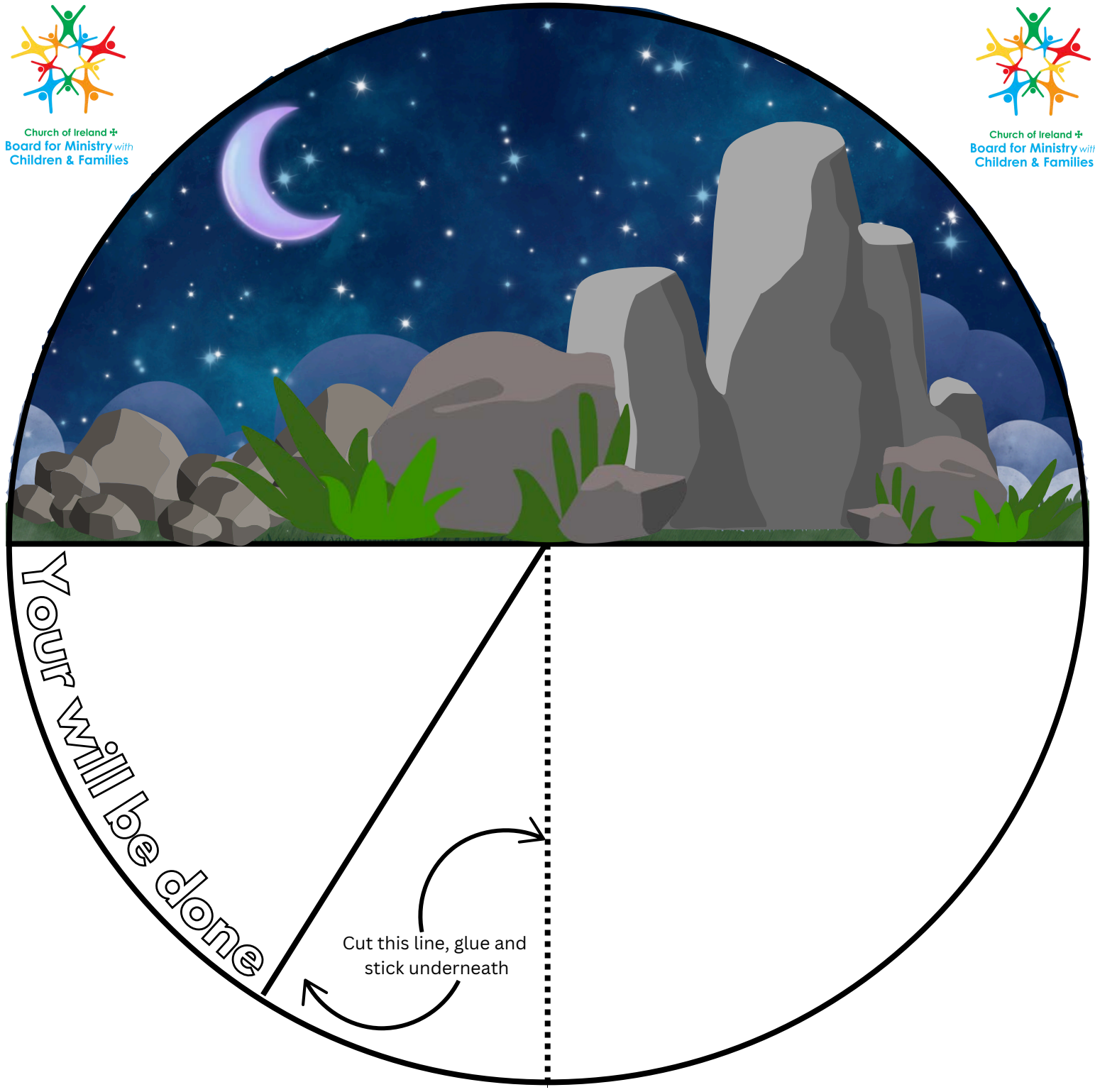
God makes with his people. " Luke 22:19-20

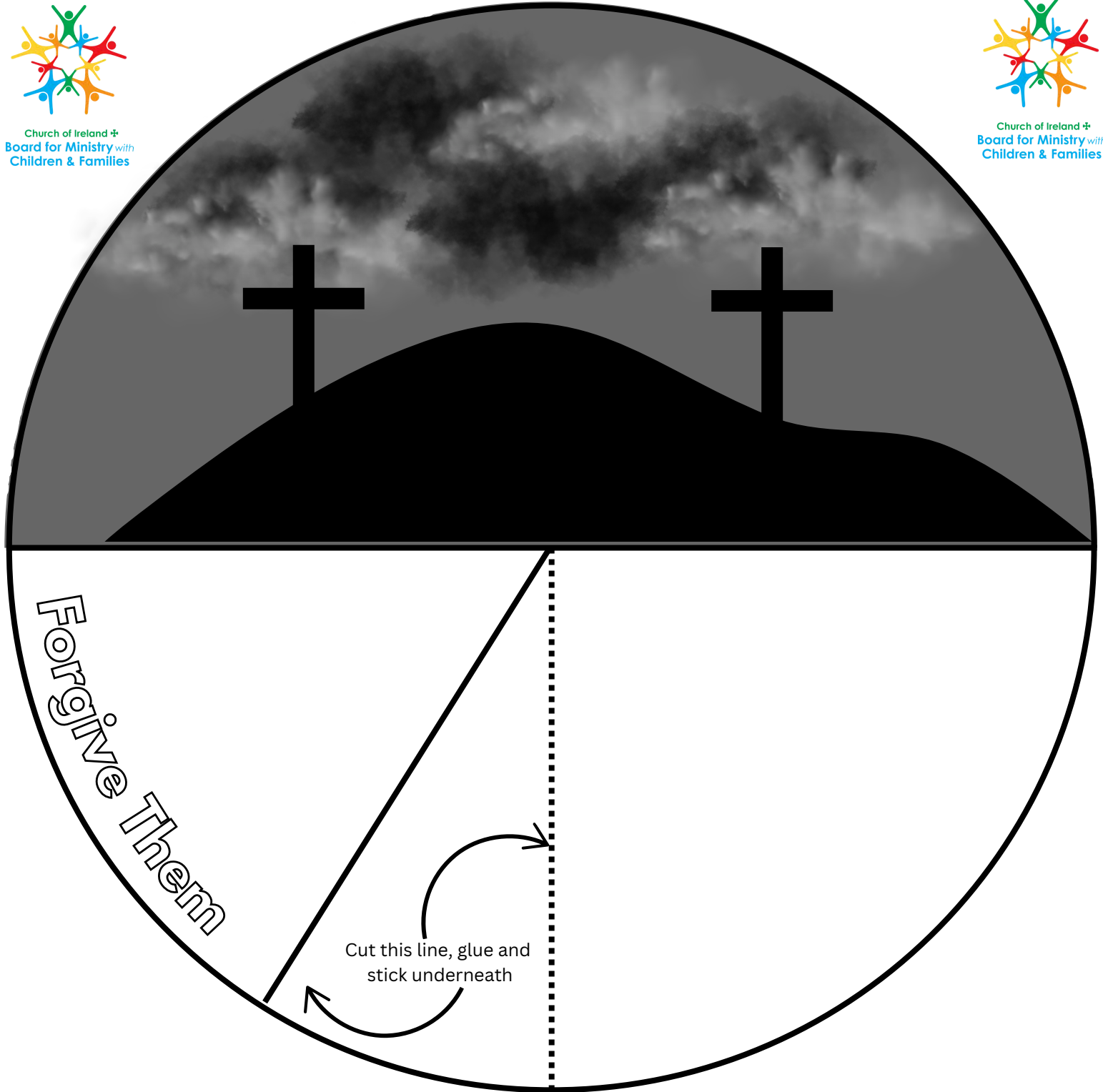

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The Death of Jesus

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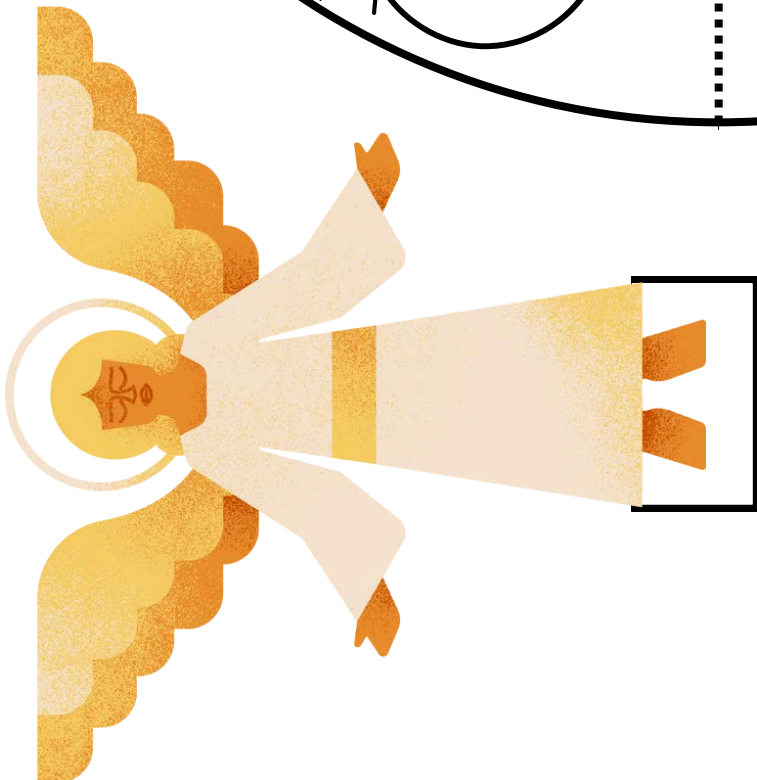
