

Hopefully by now you will have heard at least a little about our Advent Appeal this year where we have teamed up with Bishops Appeal and SAMS (South American Missions Society).

Gingerbread and Generosity, we hope, will become an annual event with a different focus each time. This year the theme is Houses of Hope because all the money raised will go towards two projects in South America who provide vital shelter and support for the most vulnerable.

ReVive run a safe house for young girls who have been exploited and provides them with security, education and a future. In Chile the local church is helping to provide food, shelter and clothing to homeless men, women and families. There is a community kitchen, a clothing bank and chance to connect with a community and feel less isolated.









## We would love your church to host a Houses of Hope Gingerbread House decorating event!

This event can take place at the end of a service as a fun time for all ages to connect, or you could organize it as a **Messy Church** event open to the wider community, with an entry fee for families to decorate pre-prepared gingerbread houses. Additionally, this can be incorporated into your **Sunday Club** or **Toddler group** Advent celebrations.

The church pack includes everything you need to host the event, including a trail and quiz that engages participants of all ages while educating them about the supported projects. We also provide two service outlines with talks that you can adapt as needed—one is tailored for the Advent period, and the other can be used after Christmas or as an alternative to Christingle. There is also a family pack that you can print and give to families, allowing them to participate at home with craft templates, puzzles, and recipes. **DOWNLOAD PACKS HERE.** 

No matter which pack you choose, anyone who decorates a gingerbread house can take a photo and upload it to the competition page for a chance to win a £50/€50 One4All voucher.










# Play Away Nativity


This Advent we are taking you back to your youthful days with our own version of the retrogame of Top Trumps - Hope Trumps!


#### EMBRACE THE OPPORTUNITIES

#### FLIPPING THE PERFORMANCE

Particularly at this time of year the children get put on stage to "perform." Relatives and friends sigh and laugh as the baby Jesus is dropped into the manger, the angels halo slips slowly down over their eyes, the donkey's back legs trip over the front legs and they crash head first into the Christmas tree!

As cute as it is, many children get pulled into so many performances – school, church, visiting the retirement homes – and the message can often get lost in the midst of learning lines and fighting over who gets to be Mary. So why not flip the performance and have the adults in your church up on stage in dodgy costumes for a change? Invite the children to watch and laugh and learn alongside the adults. Alternatively have the whole congregation come dressed as characters from the Nativity and lead an Instant performance where people stand up when their character is mentioned.

# INSTANT NATIVITY SCRIPTS

Engage Worship's Scratch Nativity: This nativity needs no rehearsal, and only a small amount of preparation. This can be advertised for everyone to come along dressed as any character from the story, and it doesn't matter how many of each character you have (although at least one of each is helpful!): Angel, Mary, Joseph, Star, Shepherd, Wise man, Donkey, other animals (optional) ...and a King Herod . 




#### SUNHATS & WELLIE BOOTS: Star Trail

**Sew Blessed** – a sewing group for beginners who follow a simple pattern to make <u>heart bookmarks</u> for Valentines day; <u>Paint and praise</u> – simple painting challenges for all abilities with worship music in the background; **Music mash up** – a chance to learn the basics of a specific instrument, you never know, you could discover a new worship team!; <u>Bake through the Bible</u> – there's already a great series of books for this – click the underlined text open the links.

There really are so many ideas and we are blessed with some amazingly talented people, encourage them by helping them to encourage others.

Make it clear that these are opportunities for ALL ages to spend time together. Think about the time of day you run it (not during school time, nor too late for those who don't like driving in the dark). Be clear also that children must be accompanied by their parents, this increases the whole family connection and cuts down on the volunteer/child ratios challenge and Access NI/Garda checks.
